FORENSIC SCIENCE

Session 1: 8:00am - 10:00am *Alternate Light Sourcing and Latent Fingerprint Capture*

Session 2: 10:15am - 12:15pm *Chromatography and Analysis of Questioned Documents*

Session 3: 12:45pm - 2:45pm *Fiber Capture and Analysis*

Ever wonder what the people on those CSI shows really do? The truth is often different than what is shown on TV. In this class we will look at some of the techniques used by forensic scientists to acquire, analyze and report on evidence in evidence in criminal cases. This includes fiber capture and analysis, chromatography of inks, examination of crime scenes using alternate lighting systems, detection and capture of latent fingerprints, and examination of trace evidence such as fingerprints.

TINKERING WITH APPS

A 5-day program for students who are curious about exploring the basics of computer science and want to build their own mobile apps. App Inventor for Android is an open-source web application originally provided by Google and now maintained by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). Assembled pre-written blocks of Java code are used to create the applications. Every student will create a game to keep on their phone or tablet. It allows anyone, new or experienced, to dabble in computer programming and create software applications for the Android operating system (OS). No programming experience required. *Mobile apps are designed to run on smartphones or tablets, not laptops or desktops. Students will need to bring their own Android phone or tablet. Tablets are available for those who need them.

This class will use the word "PURPLE" as an illustration of our covenant relationship with Christ. Before we were saved, we were "Blue". But because of the blood of Jesus, when we received Him as our Savior, we entered a covenant relationship with Him and we became "purple." We can never go back to being "blue" again, although sometimes we act "blue" – we act like our old flesh. Throughout the study, we take that word PURPLE and break it down as to what it means to live life as a woman of God. We will discuss: P – Prayer life, being in the Word and learn basic Bible study techniques to make our time in the Word meaningful and relevant and not just an item to check off our "to do" list of being a good Christian. U—Unity, the more we are in the Word, the more we realize that as a body of believers, we are connected to each other. We must understand that each Christian is a child of God— our brother or sister in Christ – and like any good parent, our Heavenly Father wants us to get along! R – Righteousness, where we learn how our choices reflect our heart. The things we find entertaining, the activities we are involved with, the people we associate with all need to be filtered through the truth of God's word. P – Purity, where we talk about how purity should be pursued—not just living to avoid impurity, but really striving to be pure in body, soul and mind. L – Love, where we expand more practically what it means to practice the two greatest commandments: to love the Lord with all your heart, soul, mind and strength; and to love your neighbor as yourself. E - Eternal Perspective, always living in view of eternity, realizing our time here on earth is so short compared to eternity. The choices we make, the things that cause us to be anxious, etc., must be put into perspective – God's perspective.

FINGERPRINT ANALYSIS

Fingerprint analysis has been used to identify suspects and solve crimes for more than 100 years, and it remains an extremely valuable tool for law enforcement. One of the most important uses for fingerprints is to help investigators link one crime scene to another involving the same person. In this class we will look at the technologies of finding latent fingerprints, retention and documenting impression evidence, and analyzing the print features to aid law enforcement in putting a person at the scene of a crime with this unique pattern of an individual's fingertips. We will also discuss how the AFIS database converts features to a digital number.
